

The Trinium Method of Agriculture

For the love of the land

Too often in today's world, agriculture is evaluated only by economic and production standards. In a simplistic view, farming, and agriculture as a whole, is vital for the existence of humanity as it is the main source of materials and food necessary for life. Thus, the farmer or gardener acts directly within the laws of life, and should wisely maintain the environmental balance of the land. There is never assurance that all the seeds that are sown will be born, or that weather will not hinder the success of the farmer's efforts. Life, above all, is full of infinite variables and events.

Normally, we consider the laws of life to be confined to terrestrial existence and that our concerns are merely to sow, to grow, to reproduce, and to die. To "know" these laws, science relies on analysis of the soil and the plant components. But how are these analyses carried out? You take the sample, which is dry material or ashes, and analyze those dry parts. But the values that are obtained are related to the "corpse" of the land or the plant, not the life that was within it.

It is quite a different matter whether, in order to learn about the soil or the plants or the animals in all their aspects, we consider the laws of life that permeate the entire cosmos, the earth, planets, and stars, which contain an endless sea of life with currents, flows, rhythms and unseen forces. The earth must also be seen as more than simply a support to bring forth what is cultivated. At times, the earth is a support that seems to hinder our work by hosting many different types of weeds and pests. The earth is a living being, a loving mother who generously gives to man her fruits to eat. But all creatures must maintain their own balance to survive and thrive. The balance of the earth has been deeply altered by man's misguided reliance on chemicals and other pollutants to try to bring about greater productivity. Now problems have developed on top of the solutions that were sought to fix the original problem.

The Trinium method of agriculture was developed by Eureka Institute, over many decades of research and trials, to help bring balance and harmony back to the land and all its species. This is the true responsibility of agriculture. It is a holistic method which aims to create balance and thereby rejuvenate the harmonious synthesis inherent in the rhythms, forces, and processes that weave through all levels of life.

Specifically, the Trinium method uses products, devices, and harmonizing systems to address the various stages of healing, purifying and nurturing of the ecosystem.

As a first phase of preparation for the healing and fertilizing of the land, various preparations are derived from raw materials using homeopathic processes of extraction. In homeopathy, the essential "energy current" of a raw material, such as a specific plant, is extracted and allowed to rise in resonance to the system of cosmic forces from which it originates. The extraction process can be by maceration, decoction, infusion, charring, calcination, distillations, roasting, etc.

The second phase is identifying a natural substrate, generally a mineral component such as clay or silicates, chosen for its intrinsic characteristics that determine the synergistic resonance, its compatibility, with the energy current of the substance extracted in the first phase.

The third phase consists of joining, in various proportions and using various rhythms, the two unique components. This allows the new substance to manifest particular attributes of harmonization, revitalization, adaptation, and enhancement of vital processes within soils, plants, animals, and man.

The scope of the Trinium method extends beyond the basic garden or farm to include processed foods, devices which improve the quality of water, the development of harmonious agricultural organisms, as well as the design of buildings which support the quality of life and its healthy function.

Development of the Trinium method

The Trinium method is the natural evolution of a methodology previously referred to as homeodynamics. Homeodynamics, in turn, was the natural evolutionary development of the system for a new agriculture indicated by Rudolf Steiner in 1924, known as biodynamics. Steiner gave indications for making the so-called biodynamic (BD) preparations from natural substances such as minerals, medicinal plants, or bovine manure left to age underground in specific animals organs during the appropriate seasons. These preparations act as organic enhancers to assist new cosmic forces to flow on earth and thereby bring life and resonance between the plants and the preparations.

Giving particular respect to Steiner's plea to farmers in 1924 to carry this methodology into the future, by further developing the preparations and especially by giving attention to the overall farm organism and trees, Eureka Institute strives to continually understand the modern day challenges and to develop techniques and preparations capable of meeting those challenges. The Trinium method capitalizes on the indications from Rudolf Steiner and uses homeopathic techniques to "potentize" preparations bringing them to a level of efficacy and accuracy capable of meeting the issues of today's world.

The new Trinium method has clear advantages:

- the increase in both quantity and quality of all aspects of life;
- the absence of any undesirable residues in the soil, plants, or water;
- the low cost of the materials;
- the simple and convenient method of application.
